


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OKAJI SZAMORODNI

Tokay, the "par excellence" wine-growing district of Hungary, has a place of its own among the world's foremost wine regions. It is the land of the genuine Tokay Aszu — the noblest natural sweet wine of the world — second to none in its unique bouquet. Wine-growing in the Tokay district looks back upon the traditions of many centuries — some experts claim that it was already begun under Roman rule — the Tokay wines, Tokay Aszu above all, enjoying a world-wide reputation as early as the 15th and 16th centuries. Tokay wines have ever since maintained their fame worthy of a glorious past. The superior quality of these wines is the direct result of a happy combination of beneficient climatic conditions, advantageously situated vineyards and a favourable volcanic soil.

On the gentle slopes of the Tokay hills autumn is a

lingering guest. The grapes shrivelling up under the heat

of the autumn sun become "aszu" berries. Conse-

quently their sugar content greatly increases and the aromatic substances mature, lending that berries into a dough and adding it to the must.

Szamorodni, on the other hand, is made of overripe clusters containing more or less aszu-berries. It appears that the grade of sweetness in the case of Szamorodni depends on the prevailing autumn climate, i. e. on the quantity and the shrivelled-up character of the aszu-berries contained in the clusters. Two varieties of Szamorodni are known
